

Cook County Landlord Eviction Checklist

1. Before You Start, Consider All Your Options

MEDIATION : You may be able to work out a resolution with your tenant without going to court. The <u>Center for Conflict Resolution</u> offers free mediation. Call 312-922-6464 x 22 or email <u>newcase@ccrchicago.org</u> .
RENTAL ASSISTANCE : You may be eligible for rental assistance when you file for eviction. To learn more, visit www.illinoishousinghelp.org/cbrap or call 866-454-3571.



2. Make Sure You Have All Your Paperwork

You can find forms required to file an eviction case and more information on the **Chicago Volunteer Legal Services website** or call **855-956-5763** for additional assistance with filing an eviction case in Cook County. Taking these steps **before** filing a case can avoid delays.

LEASE : Include a copy of the lease when you file your case. If you never had a written lease with your tenant, you should include a sworn statement about your understanding of the terms of the lease.
NOTICE/AFFIDAVIT OF SERVICE : This is a sworn statement that will tell the judge <i>how</i> and <i>when</i> you gave your tenant the Eviction Notice. This Notice must be delivered to tenants in a specific way. Review the resources above for instructions.
EVICTION NOTICE : Before you can file a case, you must give your tenant the appropriate eviction notice and wait the number of days stated in the notice

_ _	AFFIDAVIT ABOUT MISSING DOCUMENTS: If you do not have the Eviction Notice, Affidavit of Service, or Lease, then include an Affidavit that tells the judge what the missing paperwork said. COMPLAINT, SUMMONS, AND CIVIL ACTION COVER SHEET: You must complete these forms that explain why you are filing a case, what you are seeking from the court, and how the tenant can respond.
	3. Begin Your Court Case
	COURT FEES: You will need to pay a fee to file your case. You can call 312-603-5030 if you have questions.
	E-FILING : All court papers must be filed electronically. If you need help with filing, you can call 312-603-5030 or 833-411-1121.

SERVICE: After you have filed your court papers, you will need to have them served by the Sheriff and pay the required fee. You will need to <u>file directly with</u>

the Sheriff's Office to begin this process. This can be done online or in person at the Daley Center, Bridgeview, Markham, Maywood, Rolling

Meadows, or Skokie courthouses.
